INTRODUCTION


- The Nairobi County 2027 gubernatorial race is gaining momentum, with six candidates
- already declaring their interest in the seat as of September 1, 2025.
- The six are
 - Incumbent Governor Johnson Sakaja, who is seeking reelection,
 - Embakasi East MP Babu Owino,
 - Immediate former KEMSA board chair Irungu Nyakera,
 - Embakasi North MP James Gakuya
 - Businesswoman Agnes Kagure
 - Former Nairobi governor Evans Kidero.
- TrendsLab Kenya sought to find out who among the six Nairobi electorate prefers and why.

METHODOLOGY


- Survey Date: Monday, September 1- Friday, September 6.
- Data Collection Methodology- Quantitative interviews
- Geographical location and sample size: 4000 registered Nairobi voters proportionately distributed across 17 constituencies in Nairobi.
- Margin of error: +-1.
- Degree of confidence: 96%.
- Response Rate: 95%.


DEMOGRAPHICS




GENDER DISTRIBUTION

Evans Kidero	32%
Babu Owino	28%
Irungu Nyakera	14%
James Gakuya	11%
Johnson Sakaja	10%
Agness Kagure	5%

DISCUSSION

- Evans Kidero
 - Supported mainly by responders over 28 years
 - Lauded for introducing a business-like approach to county leadership
 - Nairobi CBD had order during his tenure with hawkers operating from designated areas
 - Responders believed he was at least the best compared to his predecessors
 Mike Sonko, Anne Kananu and Johnson Sakaja
 - Affordable charges, including parking fees

Babu Owino

- Enjoys huge support from the young generations
- Lauded for championing human rights, ie representing arrested young people in court
- Good development track record as an MP

Johnson Sakaja

- Respondents voiced Sakaja has failed to deliver on his key campaign promises, such as fixing water shortages and improving drainage systems
- The Nairobi CBD is disorganised
- Increased crime rates and insecurity in Nairobi
- Financial mismanagement and corruption allegations
- Questionable recruitments in City Hall.

James Gakuya

- Respondents who chose Gakuya cited his development track record as an MP, including education infrastructure development.
- Gakuya was also lauded for being vocal on matters affecting Nairobians

Irungu Nyakera

- Responders who settled on Nyakera cited his track record in public service, including reforms in the tea sector.
- ► They also lauded his performance as Transport Principal Secretary

- Agres Kagure
 - Responders opined that Kagure doesn't have a clear plan for Nairobi
 - Seems like a political project
